

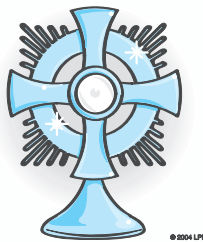

CAPS/COUCNILS REPORT:

Tuesday January 5, our three parish councils met at St. Peter school cafeteria. (This is the third time our councils met on the same night at the same place to facilitate discussion among the councils.) There was a presentation by Dr. Mark Kemmeter from the Milwaukee Archdiocese—he's the coordinator of the Parish Mission office that serves parish councils. He talked to our councils about different configurations of councils in other clusters in our Archdiocese, he told our councils that there is no master plan for what is to happen in our cluster, but the plans need to come from our parishes and be embrace by the parishes; and there was an opportunity for questions and answers.

There was also a brief presentation of the last CAPS (Catholic Association of Port Washington/Saukville) Committee meeting with the affirmation of the decision to continue the current mass schedule and look at the data in a year.
